




Introduction & Inception



Based on multi-city consultations of Disaster Risk Management (DRM) Professionals throughout India, the Confederation of Risk Reduction Professionals (CRRP) was formed with an aim to provide a platform to the YYPs to promote practical application of Science, Engineering, Technology and Innovation (SETI) for disaster risk reduction for making India disaster resilient.

It started with a WhatsApp group in February, 2019 and became a **legal entity** by August, 2019. CRRP became a part of **U-Inspire Alliance** by signing the **Jakarta Declaration** in September, 2019.


Structure of CRRP

welcoming and interactive digital space, where we hosted a diverse range of interesting and informative sessions to exchange knowledge and share experiences, practices, and research.


