



## Introduction & Inception



Based on multi-city consultations of Disaster Risk Management (DRM) Professionals throughout India, the Confederation of Risk Reduction Professionals (CRRP) was formed with an aim to provide a platform to the YYPs to promote practical application of Science, Engineering, Technology and Innovation (SETI) for disaster risk reduction for making India disaster resilient.

It started with a WhatsApp group in February, 2019 and became a **legal entity** by August, 2019. CRRP became a part of **U-Inspire Alliance** by signing the **Jakarta Declaration** in September, 2019.


#### Structure of CRRP






#### Chapter 1 CRRP and COVID-19 - COVID Monitor




Project – Avoidable Deaths from the Effect of the COVID-19 Pandemic and Lockdown in India


The document was circulated a mong all important stakeholders like NDMA, NDRF, SDRF, NGOs etc.

#### Chapter 2 CRRP and COVID-19 - Risk Communication


RRP came out with a number of initiatives to 'communicate' the 'risk' associated with or 'science' behind COVID-19.

CRRP understood that using terms like 'lockdown', 'flattening the curve', 'daily case surge', at times, become overwhelming for an ordinary man. Thus, CRRP came up with the following:

- Documentation of community based disaster risk management strategies of indigenous communities.


### Chapter 4 Mili Juli

- Quashing the cognitive biases surrounding the ideas - community based disaster risk management is confined to rural settings, heritage is only sites and precincts, communities at remote sites are instinctively vulnerable.
- Re-defining the way documentation is done -

- in form of 'comics' to attract a larger group of audience.
- Designing a guidebook to virtually interact and stimulate conversations on community based risk reductions amongst youth and young professionals.


